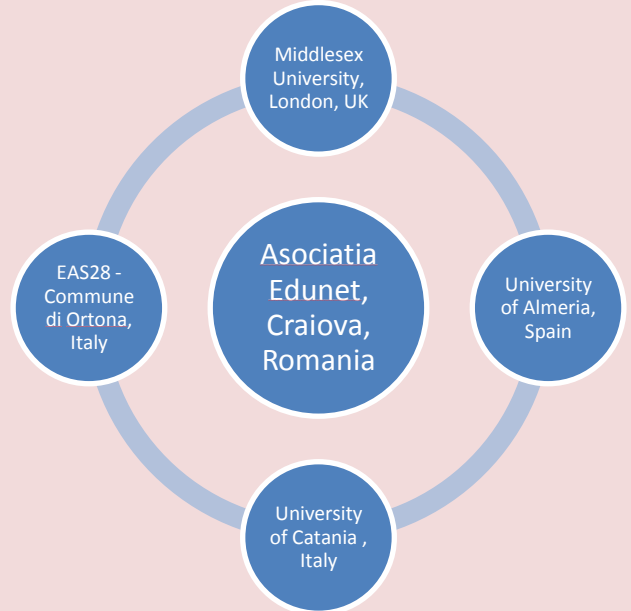

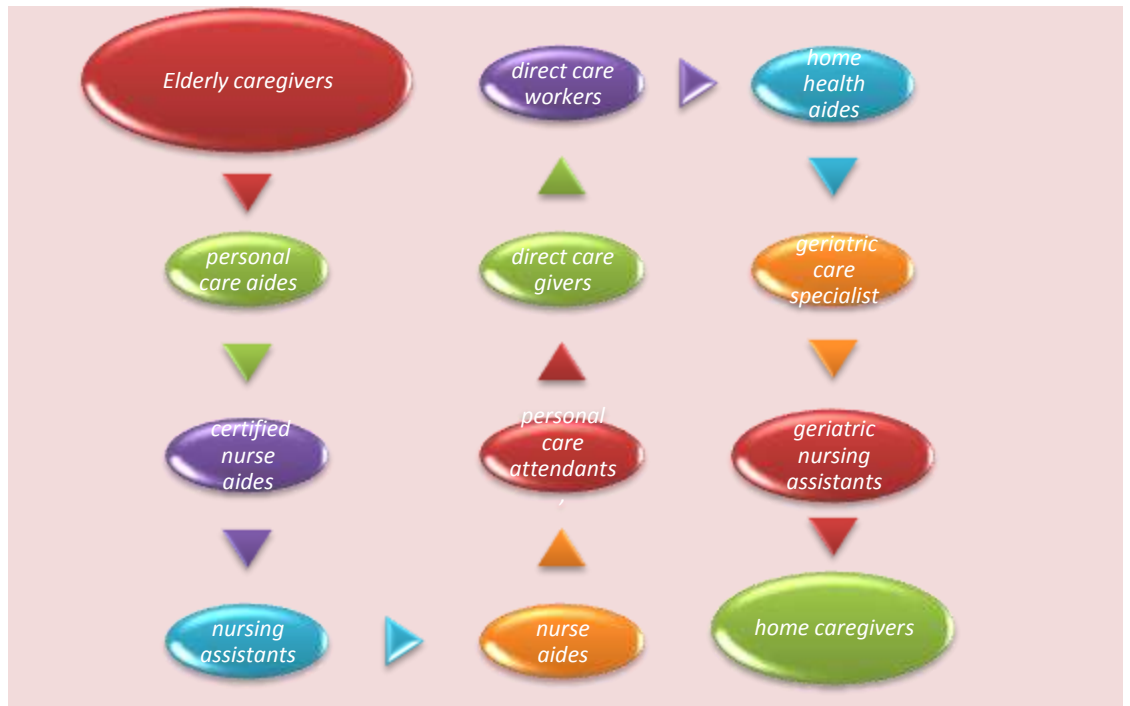

The main outputs of the project will be a **Massive Open Online Course (MOOC)** and the **Open Educational Resources (OER)**, available on the project **Web site**

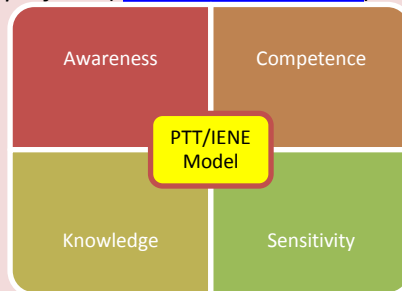
